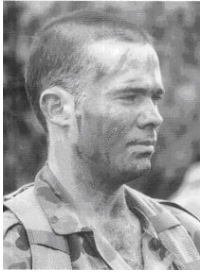
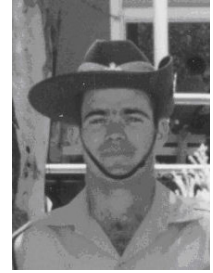

Jordan was born in Esperance, WA, on 10 July 1980 to Mary Holliday (nee Pedler) of Cummins and Ross Holliday of Tumby Bay. The family returned to Tumby Bay in 1987 where Jordan completed his schooling to Year 12 in 1997.

Jordan was a keen sportsman playing football for the Tumby Bay Blues in both Colts and Reserve grades. He was a member of the Colts Grand Final winning team of 1995.

He also played cricket for the Rovers in B Grade.

After leaving school he worked for Bobby Harris for 12 months, and then moved to Adelaide from where he joined the Army in 2000.

Jordan has been on active service in both Timor (Oct 2002 – Apr 2003) and Afghanistan (2007). His initial service was as a Combat Engineer with 1 Combat Engineer Regiment; he then undertook further training at the Army Apprentices School and the School of Military Engineering to gain the trade of Carpenter and was posted to 21 Construction Squadron in Brisbane.
